## Bridge Conventions:

## Negative \& Takeout Doubles

It is important to know the difference between a negative double and a takeout double. This chart will hopefully help you understand the subject.

## DIFFERENCES BETWEEN NEGATIVE DOUBLES AND TAKEOUT DOUBLES



- Partner opened
- The double is made by the responder
- The overcaller's suit is doubled
- $6+\mathrm{HCP}$ are needed at the one level; more at higher levels
- Emphasis is on the unbid major(s)
- You need not be short in the opponent's suit
- A negative double followed by a bid in a new suit is weak

| Level of Overcall | HCP Needed |
| :--- | :---: |
| One of a suit | 6 |
| Two of a minor | 8 |
| Two of a major | 9 |
| Three of a suit | 10 |
| Four or higher of a suit | 10 |

TAKEOUT DOUBLES

- An opponent opened
- The double is made by the overcalling side
- Opener's suit is doubled
- $11+\mathrm{HCP}$ are needed at the one level; more at higher levels
- Coverage in all unbid suits is promised
- You must be short in the opponent's suit
- A takeout double followed by a bid in a new suit is strong ( $17+\mathrm{HCP}$ )

Aggressive action is called for when:
$\checkmark$ You are short in the opponent's suit,
\&/or
$\checkmark$ You know you have a fit,
\&/or
$\checkmark$ You have tolerance for opener's suit, \&/or
$\checkmark$ You have aces and kings \&/or
$\checkmark$ You have ideal distribution in the unbid suit(s).

Discretion is recommended with:
$\checkmark$ Length in the opponent's suit
\&/or
$\checkmark$ Shortness in partner's suit,
$\checkmark$ Flawed distribution in the unbid suits,
$\checkmark$ A hand that is dominated by minor honors.
